Jürgen Trittin, former Federal Minister for the Environment, is currently serving as a member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs in the German Parliament and has been since 2014. Since the 20th parliamentary term, he further serves as foreign policy spokesperson for the parliamentary group Alliance 90/The Greens. Moreover, he is a member of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly. In 2015 and 2016, he co-chaired the Commission to Review the Financing for the Phase-out of Nuclear Energy in Germany. In 2018, he was elected to the Board of Trustees of the Nuclear Waste Disposal Fund.

Since 1998, Jürgen Trittin has been a Member of the German Parliament. He was Chairman of the Parliamentary Group Alliance 90/The Greens in the German Parliament from 2009 to 2013 and Vice-Chairman in charge of Foreign, Security and European Policy from 2005 to 2009. He served as Federal Minister for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety from 1998 to 2005.

In 1994, he was elected chairman of the party Alliance 90/The Greens, a position he held until 1998.

After having won a seat in the Regional State Parliament of Lower Saxony in 1985, Trittin was Minister for Federal and European Affairs in the Regional State of Lower Saxony from 1990 to 1994.

Jürgen Trittin holds a master degree in Social Sciences from the University of Göttingen, Germany, and has worked as a research associate, press spokesperson of Alliance 90/The Greens in the Regional State Parliament of Lower Saxony and as a freelance journalist.
